## **Ken Gerhardt's Comments (continued from page 1)**

Golf carts per group: As I'm sure many of our members don't read the board minutes completely, I'm copying and pasting this change to ensure you see it at least once. This new policy will take effect on August 1, 2021

- Last meeting the Committee was asked to think about and talk to members about limiting carts to two per group. This is the policy in many clubs. Purvis feels that, as the number of private carts increases, and as the number of rounds on our course increase, we need to reduce cart usage where possible. Carts not only can cause rutting, but also help compact the soils, which hinders the ability of water and fertilizer to be absorbed in the soil and thus reach the roots of the grass. All Committee members agreed that reduced cart traffic was best for the course, but it was noted that a number of members had purchased carts and paid trail fees based on the Club policy of allowing single use of private carts. Therefore, the Committee feels it is not equitable to immediately limit cart use to 2 per group when private carts are in play on a hole. After discussion, the Committee recommended that the following policies be put in place: 1) As soon as this policy is adopted and published, there shall be only two carts allowed per group during any tournament play. 2) Along with that publication, the members should be told that it is in the best interests of the Club to limit carts to 2 per group, with the reasons given. 3) Recognizing that the problem will only worsen over time, any current owner with a cart will lose the privilege when the existing owned cart is replaced and all members that do not have carts (unless a cart has been ordered by the policy publication date) will be required to follow the 2 cart per group rule. 3) All current cart owners will be strongly encouraged to share their cart so that the amount of cart traffic will be minimized. 4) All current cart owners will be notified that the Club reserves the right to limit use in the future if it is determined that doing so is important to course conditions.

## First Tee Coastal Carolinas



## **Rules, Etiquette, and Behavior on the Golf Course**

As we approach the midseason summer mark here at Carolina Colours, we thought we would address some rules, etiquette, and behaviors we have noticed.

### **Marking your golf ball when it's on the green.**

Remember to always mark your ball once it is on the putting green. To do this you take out a flat object such as a coin or a ball mark. Place the coin or your mark directly behind the ball. Once the mark is placed on the green, that is the only time you can pick up your golf ball. When it is time for you to place the ball back down, put it directly in front of the mark and pick your mark up. Your ball is now back in play.

### **Ready golf!**

Playing golf is one of the best sports to play while also being social with your friends. This being said, it is very important for you to be ready when it's time to hit your shot. An easy way to do this: while your playing partner is getting ready for their shot, make sure you know which club you're going to hit once you get to your golf ball. Don't wait until you get to your ball to decide. Golf should be played in 4 hours, the longest 4 1/2 hours. If you're not playing within this timeframe, you need to speed up your readiness when it's time for you to hit. If it's possible and you're not in front of your playing partner, grab a few clubs and walk to where your ball is located. You don't have to wait for your partner to hit their shot to get back in the golf cart and drive you over to your golf ball.

### **There are a lot of rules to this game!**

It is totally impossible for us to know all of them. If you are one who knows the rules and if you see someone is not doing something correctly, probably because they don't know the difference, please don't be afraid to mention it to them. It would probably benefit them in the long run and most people appreciate it that you have helped them!

### **Behavior on the golf course.**

We do know how frustrating this game can be! That being said, it's a game of patience/honor and knowing you will hit good shots and knowing you will hit poor shots. Golf will always be that way. Even for the best players in the world, they know they are not going to hit every shot perfect. It's really no fun playing with someone who hits a poor shot and then in a rage throws their golf club. Also, it's very unsafe for the people playing with that person. Remember it's a game. I once heard a coach tell someone who did this, "You aren't that good to get that mad."

### Letting others play through.

Usually, the general rule on the course is that foursomes have the 'right of way'. If it's a busy Saturday or Sunday morning and there are all foursomes and a few twosomes playing. Obviously, the twosomes will play faster. Again, patience is needed. If there is nowhere to go—groups on every hole—the foursome does not need to let you play through. With this being said, if it's not busy and you have faster players coming up behind you, please let them play through if you know it's open in front of you. It makes for a better game for all involved!

Let's continue to have a stellar season here at Carolina Colours. Enjoy playing this game of a lifetime!

### Drive, Chip, and Putt


Many of you may have heard about the competition for junior golfers called Drive, Chip and Putt. It is a nationwide skills competition for junior golfers who compete in driving, chipping, and putting challenges. Players earn points at an event based on performance as they attempt to qualify all the way to the National Finals—which takes place the Sunday before at The Masters Tournament in Augusta, GA!!

There are 3 stages before the final stage in Augusta, which is broadcasted on National TV. I am incredibly pleased to announce that right here from Carolina Colours, two of our own junior golfers have advanced to the second stage!

Katherine-Diane Graham who just started golfing and taking lessons this spring qualified in Wilmington, NC at Country Club of Landfall in the girls 12–13 yrs. division. She will compete in August at the second stage in Chapel Hill, NC.

Mason Huff, another of our very own junior golfers here at Carolina Colours, advanced to the second stage in Chapel Hill. Mason qualified in Wilson, NC on June 11th in the Boys.

## **Terri's Tips!**

### **Drive, Chip, and Putt**

In honor of them, I will focus just a bit on putting in this article. One of my junior golfers said to me the other day, “you drive for show, but you putt for dough!”

I had the 4 boys I was coaching practicing their up and downs. Which means you hit one chip on the green and you take one putt in the hole. I had them in a little competition. How many up and downs could they make out of 10 tries. One of the boys made 8! 80 percent, not bad! PGA tour watch out.

I always tell my students, if you have a half hour to work on your game, make it your putting. I like to have my students do the “clock drill” where you take three golf balls. Choose a hole on the putting green that will give you an uphill putt, a downhill putt, a left to right putt, and a right to left putt. Start at 12:00. Make the first two balls. If any of the first two balls don't go in, pull them back until they are in the hole. Now here is the “kicker.” You MUST make the third ball on the first try. If you miss, you can't pull it back, you must take all three balls and start over.

Do this from three feet away. Once all three balls are in the hole you move around the hole (the clock) to 3:00. You do the same drill. Again, if you miss the third ball you must start all over from that same spot. What does this do for your game?

First off you are seeing and hearing the ball drop into the cup many times. That will build confidence. Also, on that pesky third ball you are practicing a bit of pressure. After you have completed one turn around the clock, 12, 3, 6, and 9 o'clock, do the same drill, this time from six feet away. The 3 to 6 footers are the score saving putts. If you can make more than you miss you will lower your score!

## CHEF's CORNER

### Brown Sugar Glazed Meatloaf

#### Ingredients

- ¾ cup ketchup
- ¾ cup packed brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 ½ pounds grass-fed ground beef
- 1 ½ cups bread crumbs
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 1 green bell pepper, chopped
- 2 eggs
- ¼ cup milk



#### Instructions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Combine ketchup, brown sugar, and salt in a small mixing bowl and allow to sit for a couple of minutes to allow sugar to dissolve.

Spoon one-third cup of sauce into bottom of a loaf pan. Set aside.

Place ground beef, bread crumbs, onion, bell pepper, eggs, milk, and one third cup of glaze into food processor and process until mixture is thoroughly blended.

Place meat mixture into loaf pan and smooth down the top.

Spread remaining glaze on top of loaf and bake for 1 hour or until internal temperature is 155 to 160 degrees.

Remove from oven and allow to rest for 10 minutes before serving.

#### Chef Notes:

It's important to cook ground beef to an internal temperature of 160 degrees Fahrenheit. If the meatloaf is under 160 degrees, continue to bake it until it reaches that temperature to be safe

I suggest that if it has baked for an hour and still has not reached 160 degrees, check every 10-15 minutes. (If you still cannot seem to reach the minimum safe temperature, you might want to invest in an oven thermometer.)
