Online Payments

Communications have begun for the change to paperless billing on February 1st. There will be 3 new options for payments revolving around a new member portal for users to access their statement. The first and recommended option is automatic payment. There is no service charge for this method and is the simplest option for users. If you wish to be set up for automatic payments, please deliver a voided check to the member payments box in the golf shop or to Suzanne Vincent in the pavilion by **January 15th**. On the portal, you will also have access to paying with credit card (2% fee) or ACH payment (1% fee). Payments via check will still be accepted, but please note that there will be a \$5 service charge beginning February 1st.

January has arrived, and with it comes colder temperatures and true winter conditions on the golf course. While growth has slowed, there is still plenty happening behind the scenes as we focus on protecting the turf and setting ourselves up for a successful year ahead.

Winter Course Conditions

With colder weather and frost delays becoming more common, our main priority is protecting the greens. Frozen turf is extremely vulnerable to damage, so we appreciate everyone's patience and cooperation during frost delays or temporary closures. These precautions help ensure healthier turf once spring arrives.

Greens are currently rolling smoother and a bit quicker due to reduced growth, while fairways and tees are dormant but holding up well. Rough areas may look thinner this time of year, which is completely normal for winter conditions.

What the Crew Is Working On

January is a great time for our team to tackle detail work that often gets overlooked during the busy season. Projects include equipment maintenance, course clean-up, drainage work, tree trimming, and planning for upcoming improvements. We're also reviewing last season and preparing programs for the year ahead.

Tee Times Article for MGA - January 2026

December turned out to be a challenging month weather wise. We had rain, frost, cool sunny days and overcast warm days. That along with the normal holiday preparations and travel contributed to lower-than-average turnouts. Even with that, we averaged 18 players for Wednesday and Friday play.

As we end 2025, we had 82 total members, and we are now preparing for the 2026 league year.

- Dues for 2026 will remain at \$25.
- Hole-In-One Insurance will be \$10 for Wednesday and \$10 for Friday play. Remember, the MGA insurance is separate from the Club Hole-In-One insurance that is beginning on January 1st. If you pay for both and you get a hole-in-one on a Wednesday or Friday MGA league play, you are eligible to be paid from both pots.
 - o Hole-In-One insurance paid for the 2025 season covers you until the start of League play in March.
 - Members are encouraged to pay their dues and hole-in-one insurance anytime up to the start of the new league year and kick off on March 4, 2026.
 - o To make a payment, please put your check or cash in an envelope and identify your name and what the money is for and place in the MGA box in the pro-shop near the men's rest room. You may give your payment to a member of the Board as well, just be sure that you provide it in an envelope so that it can be identified.
