## Ken Gerhardt's Comments

#### Hello everyone

Hard to believe it's already June. This time of year, there is so much taking place daily. The grass is growing quickly. Here is the schedule we follow for the summer months.

- ✓ Mowing Tees: Monday and Friday
- Mowing Rough: They start on Monday and mow daily. This is scheduled to be finished by early Friday.
- Mowing Fairways: Once a week—bunkers, front nine one day, back nine the next. This continues all week.
- ✓ Mowing Greens: Five days a week. We roll them two days a week.
- ✓ Mowing Collars: Tuesday and Friday
- ✓ All the above is based on no bad weather. If we get rain, everything changes for that week.

#### **Making Tee Times**

As our membership continues to grow and the course continues to get busier, I can't stress enough the importance of our membership taking advantage of their advanced tee times.

Equity members are allowed to book tee times 14 days in advance. Associate members are allowed to book tee times 10 days in advance. The weekly players and public play are 7 days in advance. We would rather have you make an advanced tee time early and cancel later as compared to calling the day before or even day of and not able to get you on the course during the time you wish to play.

Please remember to cancel your tee time if you are unable to make it for any reason. This allows the Pro Shop to hopefully fill that time.

As we don't book public golfers more than 7 days out, this allows our membership to have top priority for prime tee times. We do book tournaments up to a year out. A tournament is defined as a group of 12 or more players.

#### **Future Online Tee Times**

Members have asked for this the past few years. Great news! We approved the cost of the software needed to allow our members to make their own tee times. This will allow you to see the tee sheet and see who is already playing. You will be able to see exactly what our team in the Pro Shop sees.

As with any new software, there will be a learning curve for our membership as well as the Pro Shop team. Once the team and I are trained on it, we will send out clear directions for you to start using it. We're hoping that this reduces the phone calls we get daily about who is playing. This project is still around two months out before this goes live.

#### **Aerification of the Greens**

To help the greens breathe better, we will be punching them three times this year. We already punched them in March. The next scheduled day is Tuesday, June 27th. The final aerification will take place the Tuesday and Wednesday after Labor Day.

#### Personal golf carts entering the course from home

This is a friendly reminder of what our policy is for entering and exiting the golf course with a personally owned cart. I'm sending this out as we continue to have challenges with these policies not being followed. Not following these may result in golf cart privileges being revoked.

- ✓ All member-owned golf carts and golf bikes may only enter or exit the course via the main driveway from Waterscape, hole #1 from Sienna Trail, or hole #9 from Waterscape. When using holes #1 or #9, only paved cart paths should be used.
  - If there are golfers on hole #1 or #9 when you attempt to enter or exit the course, please return to the road and enter or exit the course through the main driveway. If there is no one on the hole you may proceed, with caution, onto or away from the course.
  - Please be aware of pedestrians, other golfers, and maintenance staff when they enter or exit the course. DO NOT interrupt play when entering or leaving the course.
- ✓ Starting hole for all play—All play must start on hole one. Exceptions to this rule are:
  - ♦ Shotgun starts for tournament.
  - We are starting off the back nine for the day.
  - Please don't call the Pro Shop asking permission to start on a different hole.
- ✓ Driving range practice pins in front of bunker:
  - These pins were put into place to practice bunker shots. Under no circumstance should you be hitting shots from the driving range to these pins. This is for the safety of all players.

#### **Fans**

Having fans on the greens has made a huge impact on the overall conditions of those holes. We elected to purchase another fan this year. This fan will be placed on hole #3. As you have seen in the past, the front part of this green takes a beating from the heat. The fan will be placed left of the greens side bunker and give us the best wind flow needed for the area we're protecting. This year we will have fans on holes 2, 3, 5, 12, and 16.

## News from the Pro by Jim Ferree, PGA

As we move into the meat of our 2023 season, I hope everyone is getting their golf games dialed in and June provides us with optimal weather conditions. At least the law of averages should favor us with some upcoming sunny weekends. The May showers and warmer temps have our fairways greening up and our greens rolling true.

Speaking of our greens, during the month of June your Pro Shop Staff will be launching our "Love Our Greens" campaign to heighten awareness of each golfer's responsibility of repairing ball marks and basic green care. I know our members are doing their part, so if we can get our public play on board, we'll see a significant improvement in our putting surfaces enabling everyone to enjoy the course even more. An order of new ball mark repair tools will be arriving in the Pro Shop soon, which will make green repair much quicker and easier than just using a golf tee.

## Star Performer of the Month!

On May 10th, John Durham fired a near flawless one over par 73.

Ken Zircle, with machine-like precision, put together a 39, 39 – 78 round one week later.

Tracy Carruthers shot 88 and 89 within a 5-day stretch, earning exceptional play status with her GHIN.







We were fortunate to have more willing bodies than tasks that needed to be filled, so if you did not make this list, thank you for your willingness.

## Par for the Course - Peter Eckle

Markings on the golf course have continued to improve over time thanks to the efforts of members like Jim McGraw and Jeff Ackerson. We all need to know what we're faced with in different situations, e.g. white stakes, red stakes, yellow stakes, green stakes, in order to take the appropriate action. There are some situations where its





critical that a stake has not gone missing when it comes to a transition like you see in these pictures. Anything left of the white stake is OB, necessitating a reload from the spot of the previous shot. Anything right of the red stake still results in a penalty, but allows you to drop within 2 clubs lengths from where the ball crossed the hazard.



Here is something many of us didn't know. When a green has been aerated you have to be very careful about what you do when it comes to repair work on the green. Fix a ball mark you made or another player made. No problem. Fix something caused by the aeration and you've got big problems according to USGA. Here is what they say- "If a player repairs an aeration hole on the putting green, there is a penalty under <a href="Rule 13.1c(2">Rule 13.1c(2</a>) only if it improves the player's line of play, area of intended swing, area of intended stance or lie of ball. That penalty is the General Penalty of loss of hole in match play and 2-strokes in stroke play. If

no improvement results from the act, there is no penalty. Looks like a crazy rule that some day they may rethink mostly because of how it gets interpreted in many ways.

## Terri's Tips!

#### Change Your Set Up into a 'Launch' Angle to Hit the Driver Longer!

Probably the most asked question I get, "Can you teach me how to hit my driver longer?" Yes, I can, with a few changes in your set up, you may gain a few more yards off the tee!

\* You need to make sure you are set up in the launch position before you start your swing. IF you want to hit it longer, you need to keep the ball in the air longer!



Notice the shoulders in this picture. You will set up with the ball just inside your front foot. As your head is set behind the ball, just tilt your spine angle a 'little bit' to the right or left if you are a lefty. This will give you a little more weight on your back foot. (It's usually a 50/50 weight distribution with fairway/iron shots.)

Doing this will tilt your shoulder into your 'Launch' position.

\* From here, just make your normal rotation / turn into your backswing. Keeping your head in the same position as your set up, just rotate into your full finish. This should allow you to hit the driver on the 'upswing' off the tee!

## **CHEF's CORNER**

#### **Pan Fried Cinnamon Bananas**

These pan fried cinnamon bananas are soooooo good! They only take a few minutes to make and they transform boring old bananas into a drool-worthy snack or dessert. I eat my pan fried bananas all on their own, but they would taste amazing (seriously AMAZING) served over ice cream. Or you could eat them with yogurt. Or even on french toast or



pancakes. They're caramelized on the outside with a soft and sweet inside and make a great dessert topping. Yum!

My family goes bananas for bananas. (Sorry, I had to do it...). It shocks me how many bananas we go through in our house. Bananas might be one of the most boring foods out there... in my opinion anyway. But they are one of those foods that everyone will eat. Not everyone necessarily loves them, but pretty much everyone in our house will eat a banana without complaining.

#### **Ingredients**

2 Bananas CUT INTO 1/2" PIECES 1/2 teaspoon Cinnamon 1 Tablespoon butter 2 Tablespoons raw honey OR REGULAR HONEY

#### Instructions

Combine the cinnamon, butter and honey in a frying pan over medium-high heat until melted and combined.

Add the banana slices and cook for 4 minutes until the bottoms start to caramelize and turn golden brown. Adjust the temperature and cooking time as needed so that they don't burn.

Flip all the banana pieces and cook for another 4 minutes until the other side is golden brown.
