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
## Golf Management News





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

## Par for the Course by Peter Eckle

Rule 17.1 describes how to take relief from a red or yellow penalty area. Even if you are not color blind, there can be a bit of confusion between these two. Both colors come with a one stroke penalty, but with red you have 3 options.



Each of these is shown in the image above.

- 1) Go back to the location where you made the previous shot
- 2) Go as far back, on back of the line between the green and the point at which the ball entered the penalty area (dropping from knee height within 2 club lengths), and
- 3) Drop laterally, no closer to the hole within 2 club lengths of the penalty area.

In a yellow penalty area, there are only two options, which are the same as 1 and 2 described above. Here is a word of caution when it comes to dropping the ball and where it might end up: Just make sure it is not touching the line or in the penalty area.



Cam Smith apparently did not know that aspect of rule 17.1 when he made his drop. As a result, he was assessed an additional 2 stroke penalty after the fact for hitting his shot that was clearly touching the red line and thus in the penalty area. The additional 2 stroke penalty was for violating rule 14.7, hitting from a wrong place.

It could have been worse—under the old rules, he could have been disqualified for signing a wrong score card with a lower score.

I know, this is a crazy game.

## Terri's Tips!

### How is Your Game Progressing?

So, it's almost the end of the summer, but that really doesn't mean anything here in North Carolina. We can play pretty much year-round. How is your game progressing? Have you gotten better, do you see improvement in your scoring, are you hitting more fairways, more greens in regulation?

How many putts are you taking per round? If you don't know the answer to these questions, then you need to start keeping better stats and noticing what part of your game needs attention.

During your round, to keep easy stats do this.

After you write down your score. In the upper left-hand part of the box, if you hit the fairway, write down the letter F. In the upper right-hand part of the box, if you hit the green in regulation, write the letter G. In the lower right-hand part of the box, write down how many putts you took on that green.

At the end of the round, count them up. All good players, and/or players who want to improve know these numbers.

Out of 14 fairways, if you hit only 5, we need to work on the consistency of your tee shot.

Out of 18 greens, if you only hit 6, we need to work on the consistency of your approach shots.

And this is the granddaddy of them all—how many putts. If you only hit 6 greens in regulation, and you have 36 putts, we need to work on taking less putts per round. To do this, we also need to work on hitting your chip shots closer to the hole!

The average putts per round on the PGA tour is around 27. And this is the easiest part of your game to improve. You just need to put the time in and to practice with a purpose. Start practicing putts to make, from 3 to 6 feet away. Practice up hill, downhill, right to left, and left to right putts.

Below is a nine-hole score, you can see they hit five fairways, five greens, but had 23 putts. Too many putts for five out of nine greens hit in regulation!

## CHEF's CORNER

### Toasted Chicken Pesto Sandwich

This sandwich brings the bistro right to your kitchen! Warm, toasty bread and juicy chicken with tomatoes and creamy, melty mozzarella, all accented by Italian seasoning and buttery pesto.

#### Ingredients

- 2 large boneless, skinless chicken breasts, about 1 pound
- 1 tablespoon Italian seasoning
- salt & pepper to taste
- 1 tablespoon avocado oil plus more for finishing
- 4 ciabatta rolls
- 4 tablespoons mayonnaise divided, optional
- 1/3 cup pesto divided
- 4 Roma tomatoes sliced
- 6 ounces fresh mozzarella sliced

#### Instructions

Slice chicken breasts in half lengthwise to create 3 chicken cutlets. Season both sides of each piece with Italian seasoning, salt, and pepper.

1. In a large pan, heat 1 tablespoon avocado oil over medium-high heat. Sear chicken on both sides for approximately 5 minutes, or until chicken reaches internal temperature of 165 degrees Fahrenheit.
2. Remove chicken from pan and replace with ciabatta roll halves. Toast for a minute or so on each side, until lightly golden. You may need to toast two rolls at a time depending on the size of your pan.

3. To assemble, lay toasted ciabatta roll halves on cutting board. Spread 1 tablespoon of mayonnaise on one half of each roll (4 tablespoons total). Spread 1¼ tablespoons of pesto on the other half of each roll (approximately 1/3 cup total).
4. Add one cutlet of chicken to each sandwich.
5. Add 1½ ounces of mozzarella to each sandwich (6 ounces total).
6. Add slices of 1 Roma tomato to each sandwich (4 tomatoes total).
7. Add the ciabatta roll with pesto to the rest of the sandwich. Lightly brush avocado oil on top roll, then return sandwiches to warm skillet. Cook each sandwich for 2 minutes per side, or until cheese has melted. Serve immediately and enjoy hot.

### Chef's notes:

- ✓ Leftovers: Refrigerate any leftover sandwiches for one day.
- ✓ Reheating: For best results, wrap sandwiches in foil and heat in oven until food is heated through.
