#### News from the Pro by Jim Ferree, PGA

We have a beautiful course which makes it no surprise Carolina Colours attracts summer vacationers seeking recreational activities. At the risk of stating the obvious, anyone who plays this difficult game intermittently or rarely, will not move as expediently through the course as the more seasoned players. Recently, this has created some challenges for us in controlling pace of play. Several steps can be taken to prevent and mitigate this challenge. This is especially true for groups with tee times prior to the MGA/LGA shotgun starts during the week.

First, when folks are making tee times, we can make them aware of the expectation all groups should complete their 18-hole round in 4 hours. Second, if a potentially slow group is detected, we can either encourage them to opt for a later tee time when we are less crowded or refrain from pairing other players with them if they are less than a foursome. The 4-hour norm can be reinforced with a friendly reminder when they come in the Pro Shop to register.

Once out on the course, we have 3 assets to monitor and assist pace of play: our golf carts, our starter/ranger, and the eyes of our members. Our new carts have GPS which monitors the location and pace of carts out on the course. They also give us the capability of messaging any cart falling behind and not keeping up with the group in front of them.

On Fridays through Sundays, we usually have a starter/ranger on duty to control the 1st tee and assist play. Perhaps the quickest and most reliable asset we have are our members. With a call to the Pro Shop, we can quickly be informed of any on-course backups. Once notified, the Pro Shop staff can send the carts of the slow group a message and if available, deploy someone to go out to give words of encouragement of a more personal nature.

One key point to keep in mind; in a perfect world, all golfers should be permitted to play at their own pace. While 4 hours might be the standard, some might be more comfortable with a slower pace while others can breeze around 18 holes in 3 hours or less. Proper etiquette requires us to let faster groups play through if we aren't keeping pace with the group in front of us. If you find your group out of position and feel like the group behind you is waiting, waive them up to play through. Conversely, if you find your group waiting on every shot and the group in front of you has an open course in front of them, there is nothing wrong with politely asking if you can play through if they fail to offer. A little kindness and civility go a long way to ensure everyone's enjoyment.



## **Format**





#### Men

- The maximum handicap difference between partners is 12. If partners have a larger differential than that, the higher handicap will be brought down to where handicaps are just 12 strokes different.
- -Flighted by combined handicap.
- -6 teams per flight.
- -Each team will play all of the other teams in their flight.
- Five 9 hole matches of Best Ball. Each player plays their own ball with their course handicap. The best net score of the two balls is the score for the hole.
- -Each match awards 10 points. Ipt for each hole won, 1/2 pt for a hole tied, and 1 pt for the match winner.
- -The team with the highest point total wins the flight.
- -Each flight winner will compete in the shootout to decide the Overall Champion.

#### Women

- The maximum handicap difference between partners is 12. If partners have a larger differential than that, the higher handicap will be brought down to where handicaps are just 12 strokes different.
- -Saturday is 18 hole best ball. Both players play their own ball, and the low score on each hole is what will be used.
- -Sunday is an 18 hole scramble. Use the preferred shot from the 2 players until the ball is holed.

#### Terri's Tips!

#### The Pesky Beach! (Bunker Play)

With all this hot summer time weather, I hope many of you have been to our beautiful beaches—just stay away from the white sand on the golf course! If you can't, then the information below will help you!

I know many of you struggle with sand shots / bunker play. It can be difficult if you have no clue how the club interacts with the sand and how it helps the ball out of the bunker!

I hope this article can shed some light on it and help you at least get the ball out and somewhere onto the green.

Number one rule: when in the bunker, get the ball out on your first try! It does not have to be pretty! It just must be out.

The sand wedge was made to interact with the sand. The bottom of the club, the bounce, is especially important when executing this shot. The pictures below will show you the bounce and how it should be set before you make your swing.









For your set up, the ball position should be middle or just slightly left of center. Set the club as the third picture above. The face of the club should be facing upwards, towards the sky. Setting the face like this will ensure the bounce is set and ready to do its job! More weight should be set into your left, or front knee. This should not change during the execution. This will help the club enter the sand at the appropriate point.

#### Terri's Tips! (continued from page 18)



A full swing with a good amount of wrist hinge is especially important to develop speed. Sometimes I say it is one of the easiest shots in golf as you don't have to hit the ball! The club will enter the sand using the bounce, the sand will then push the ball out.

Picture above shows sand between club and ball. This is the reason why you need a good amount of swing and speed when executing this shot. If your swing is too short and too slow, more than likely the ball will stay in the sand.

#### Par for the Course—Peter Eckle

This month we're going to depart from some of the rule situations and focus on a couple of areas that when handled properly will improve the condition of the golf course and also your game.



Golfers love to make ball marks on the green because it usually means a good shot was made and even better if its a green in regulation.

It's the golfer's responsibility to repair the mark, but it has to be done correctly for it to heal properly. Highlight, copy, and paste in your browser the link below the picture for a brief video that explains how to repair the mark properly.



Now that you see how it should be done, don't hesitate to point out to a playing partner that may not be doing it right, how it should be done.

Then look for at least one more pitch mark to fix, that someone may have overlooked.

Divots are another condition that we are used to addressing while playing, but what about when we're on the range?

On the range, there is a preferred way to create divots so when they are filled the grass has a better chance of growing in and filling out more rapidly.

The picture to the left shows a pattern you should strive for. Oh, and don't forget to fill them, the Superintendent will thank you.

#### Carolina Colours Men's Golf Association (MGA)

Bread

1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup unsalted butter room temperature
2/3 cup sugar
2 eggs-room temperature
1 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
1/2 cup milk

**Cheesecake Filling** 

8 oz. brick-style cream cheese-room temperature 1/3 cup granulated sugar 3 Tablespoons all-purpose flour 1 teaspoon vanilla

1 egg

<u>Glaze</u>

3/4 cup powdered sugar 2 Tablespoons milk or creme 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract

#### **Instructions**

Grease a 9 x 5-inch loaf pan with baking spray, and line it with parchment paper leaving a large overhang on the sides so you could easily lift the bread from the pan. Adjust the oven rack just below the center (to the lower third position) and preheat the oven to 350 F.

#### To make the crisp topping

 In a bowl stir together all-purpose flour, quick-cooking oats, light brown sugar, cinnamon, and nutmeg. Add melted butter and whisk with a fork until evenly moistened, then place in the fridge until ready to use.

#### To make cinnamon sugar

- In a small bowl mix ¾ teaspoon of ground cinnamon and 3 Tablespoons brown sugar, and set aside.
- Peel and dice apples in small 1/2-inch chunks, set aside, too.

#### For the bread

 Beat room temperature butter with sugar and vanilla extract. Add eggs and mix to combine. Add the mixture of dry ingredients (flour, salt, and baking powder) and mix to combine. Slowly pour in the milk and mix just to combine. Scrape down the bowl with a rubber spatula to make sure there are no lumps remaining.

#### To make the cheesecake filling

- Mix together softened cream cheese with sugar, flour, and vanilla. Add egg and mix just to combine, set aside.
- Toss apples with cinnamon and 2 Tablespoon granulated sugar, and set aside.

#### **Assembling**

- 1. Spread half of the batter in the prepared pan, scatter half of the apple mixture, and sprinkle with the cinnamon sugar mixture.
- 2. Spoon the cheesecake mixture over the apples and gently spread using the back of the spoon. Don't go all the way to the edges of the pan.
- 3. Next, spoon the remaining bread batter and gently smooth the top. Scatter the remaining apples and sprinkle with the crisp topping.
- 4. Bake in preheated oven for about 55-70 minutes, or until the toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. This is a heavy loaf full of apples, so if your bread takes longer, that's OK. Just tent it with aluminum foil after 30-40 minutes to prevent the top from browning too much.
- 5. Remove from the oven and cool for 20-30 minutes in the pan set on a cooling rack. Then using the paper overhang lift the bread from the pan.
- 6. To make the glaze: stir powdered sugar, milk (or creme), and vanilla. Drizzle over cooled bread.
