

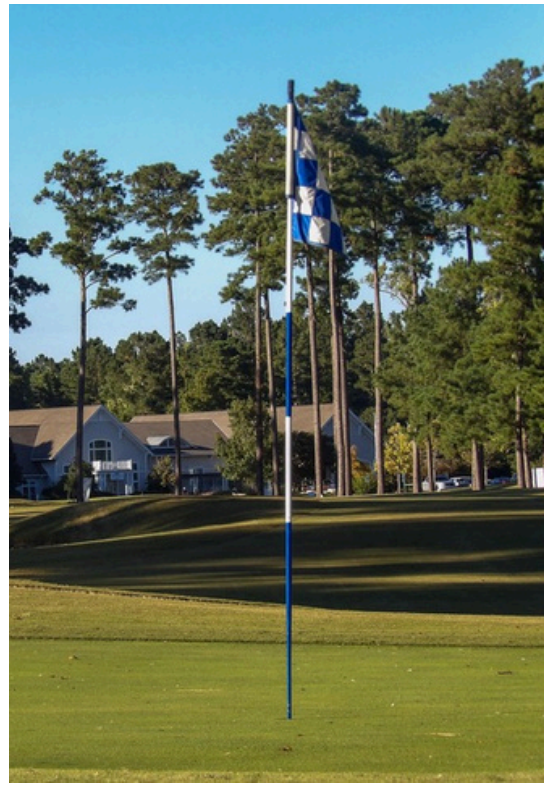

Update to the Calendar

I want to inform you all of a fairly substantial update to the calendar as we move into August. We had previously planned on aerating the greens September 1st and 2nd, but that has been moved up one week to August 25th and 26th. September is a busy month with Labor Day weekend, the New Bern Cup, and the Ryder Cup so we felt that it was in the clubs best interest to allow the greens an extra week to recover.

The MGA & LGA games scheduled for August 25th and 26th have been moved to September 1st and 2nd, and all calendars have been updated to reflect this change. We appreciate your understanding.

Booking Tee Times

I just wanted to send out a reminder that with the course being as busy as it is, it is crucial that you are only booking the amount of tee times that you will need. When using online tee times, it is perfectly fine to use “TBD” bookings while you are still filling your groups, but please be sure to either add the names of the players that will be joining you or delete the excess tee times that you won’t need as soon as possible. Weekend public fees are \$75 per player, so just one foursome booking that is not used can potentially cost the club \$300.

Driving Range

The driving range is now stocked with brand new golf balls! We have also taken the time to repaint the gazebos, replace some of the furniture, and order a few target nets to work on your short game. Get out there and practice!

August 2026 Newsletter

The dog days of summer are officially here! August is always one of the toughest months on the golf course, and this year has certainly kept us on our toes. Between the heat, humidity, and the occasional afternoon thunderstorm, our maintenance team continues to adjust each day to keep the course healthy and enjoyable. We finally were blessed with rain in the tail end of July! The course is green and healthy!

I'm happy to report that our greens have continued to hang in there this summer with the challenging weather patterns. That doesn't happen by accident—it takes a lot of planning, hand watering, monitoring moisture levels, and making the right decisions every single day. While everyone enjoys fast greens, there are times when protecting the long-term health of the turf must come first. Our goal is to provide the best possible playing conditions not just today, but throughout the rest of the season.

As we head toward September, we're already looking ahead to cooler weather and the transition into fall. The work we put in now plays a big role in how the course performs over the coming months, and we'll continue staying on top of disease prevention, irrigation management, and all the little details that often go unnoticed but make a big difference.

From the Superintendent (cont.)

This has not been an issue this past month, but if you see a member of the maintenance staff watering a green or working in your line of play, please wait until they acknowledge you or move before hitting. It only takes a few extra seconds, but it helps keep everyone safe and allows you to complete your round with minimal interruption.

As a reminder, we will be aerifying the greens for the last time this year August 25th and 26th. The course will be closed.

Lastly, thank you for your continued patience and support of our maintenance team. These long summer days are demanding, but our crew shows up early each morning with one goal—to present the best golf course we can. We truly appreciate the compliments, the encouragement, and your understanding as we work through another eastern North Carolina summer.

Have a great August, and we'll see you on the course!

Terri's Tips!

WHAT TO CHOOSE - A CHIP SHOT OR A PUTT?

When deciding whether to chip or putt the golf ball, the most important factor is the condition of the ground between your ball and the hole. If the grass is short, smooth, and free of obstacles, putting is usually the safest and most consistent option. A putt keeps the ball rolling on the ground, making it easier to control both distance and direction. Keeping the ball low is always a better choice.

Chipping is a better choice when the ball is sitting in longer grass or when there are obstacles, such as rough, a bunker, or uneven ground, between the ball and the hole. A chip shot lifts the ball into the air for a short distance before it lands and rolls toward the cup. This allows golfers to avoid hazards and improve their chances of getting close to the hole. If the hole is closer to you, choose a club which makes the ball roll less, ie., a sand wedge or pitching wedge. If the pin is farther away from you choose a club that will give the ball more roll such as an 8 or 7 iron.

I always encourage players to putt whenever possible because it is generally easier to execute than a chip shot. Putting requires a simpler stroke and carries less risk of hitting the ball too hard or too softly. Choosing the lower-risk shot often leads to fewer mistakes and lower scores during a round.

Ultimately, the decision to chip or putt depends on the situation. You should carefully evaluate the lie of the ball, the condition of the green, and any obstacles before choosing a shot. By selecting the option that offers the greatest control and the least amount of risk, players can improve their consistency and overall performance on the golf course.

I hope this helps with your course management - August is a great month to score!

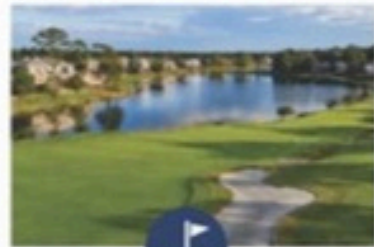

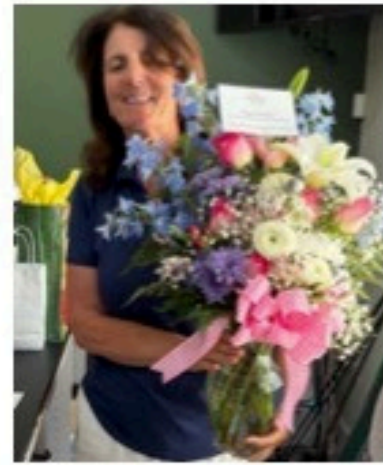

What does it mean to be a "good golfer"? 🧐

Here are a few things we can all do to make a difference—

- Give your friends the quiet they need to focus with as little distraction as possible. Remember to keep your phone on silent, avoid loud music, and pause conversations while others are teeing off or standing over the ball.
- Be mindful of where you stand or walk on the green. Try not to walk in someone's putting line. Also, standing in a golfer's line of sight can be distracting.
- Play ready golf. When it's not your turn, make sure to do everything you can to be ready to play immediately when it's your turn. Find your ball. Identify the yardage. Pick a club. Eye up the shot. Take practice swings. This can all be done while it's not your turn and it will speed up the game. Take no more than 30-45 seconds to play your shot once it's your turn.
- Remember, the BEST golf is played when you are relaxed and having fun!
