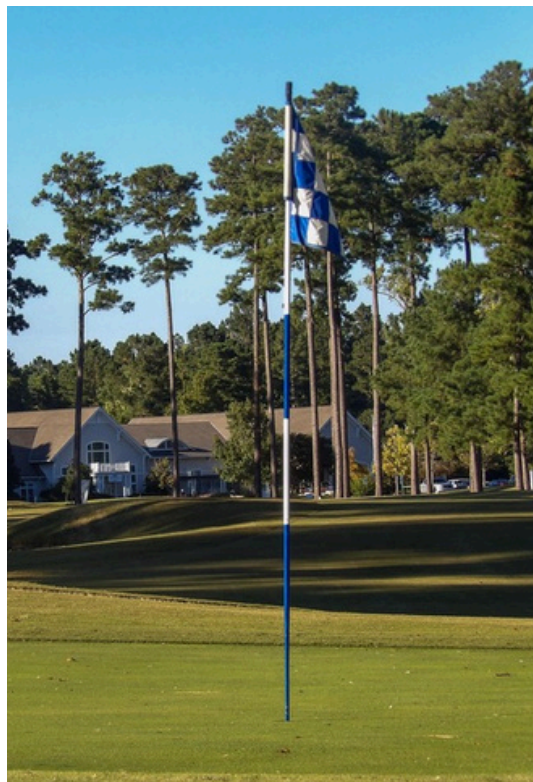

Newsletter June 2026

June is shaping up to be a busy month for the Maintenance Team, and we are excited for the start of another summer season on the course. With a full schedule ahead, our crew will be working hard to keep conditions at their best as temperatures continue to rise. Please note that greens aerification is scheduled for Tuesday, June 23rd, and the golf course will be closed that day to allow the maintenance staff time to complete the process efficiently. While aerification can be temporarily disruptive, it is an essential practice that promotes healthy turf, improves root growth, and helps maintain smooth, firm putting surfaces throughout the summer months.

As we move into the heart of the season, we are hopeful Mother Nature will lend a helping hand with some perfectly timed rainfall to keep the golf course healthy and thriving. With the recent dry conditions, our irrigation team has been spending long hours hand watering greens to maintain healthy turf and consistent playing conditions. We kindly ask all golfers to please avoid hitting into greens while maintenance employees are actively watering unless they clearly wave you up to play. This has not been an issue so far this season, and we greatly appreciate everyone's awareness and cooperation in helping us keep both golfers and staff safe on the course.

I would also like to welcome our newest maintenance team member, Martin, to the crew. Martin joins us from a neighboring golf course and already has family ties within our maintenance staff. He has hit the ground running and has been a tremendous help during a very busy stretch of the season. If you see Martin around the property, please help us welcome him and thank him for all of his hard work and dedication.

Lastly, we would like to recognize our entire maintenance staff. With a crew of just six employees, the team continues to work tirelessly each day to provide the best possible playing conditions while managing the ongoing drought stress across the golf course. Terri's Tips!

STOP TRYING !

For those of you that have taken lessons with me you would hear me countless times saying don't try. I also don't use the word try when I teach. Once you start trying tension creeps in and most everyone tightens up. I know this is easier said than done. But once you realize where you are in your motion and how you have to move and how your golf swing feels to you , that's what you should be focusing on. Once you're in the correct motion, the correct sequence of the golf swing will feel effortless and efficient.

Many golfers spend countless hours trying to hit the golf ball harder, straighter, and farther. Ironically, the more they focus on striking the ball itself, the worse their swings often become. Golf is not a game of hitting the ball; it is a game of making a proper swing that happens to send the ball toward the target. When players become obsessed with the ball, they tend to tighten up, lose rhythm, and abandon the natural motion that produces consistent shots.

Focusing on the golf ball encourages tension. Instead of making a smooth, athletic movement, golfers often lunge at impact in an effort to force the ball into flight. This tension travels through the hands, arms, and shoulders, reducing clubhead speed and making solid contact less likely. The best swings are fluid and balanced, not aggressive attempts to strike an object sitting on the ground.

Another reason to stop trying to hit the ball is that the ball is merely a byproduct of the swing. Great players focus on the target, the desired ball flight, and the quality of their motion. They trust that if they make a sound swing, the club will meet the ball correctly. By shifting attention away from the ball and toward the process, golfers often discover improved consistency and confidence.

Terri's Tips! (cont.)

Trying to hit the ball also leads many golfers to interfere with the club's natural path. Last-second adjustments, steering, and flipping the hands through impact are common mistakes that occur when a player becomes fixated on contact. These compensations frequently result in slices, hooks, topped shots, and fat shots. A golfer who commits to a complete swing rather than a hit is more likely to allow the club to move freely through the ball.

Ultimately, the goal in golf is not to hit the ball but to execute a repeatable motion that produces reliable results. When golfers stop thinking of impact as a violent collision and start viewing it as a moment within a larger movement, they often play better and enjoy the game more. The ball simply gets in the way of the swing; focus on the swing itself, and the ball will take care of the rest.

We are getting into the golf season. The weather has been phenomenal. The course is in remarkable shape. Have fun, go to the range and practice on your rhythm and your timing, practice on your finishing position ,your balance, your feel and just stop trying!

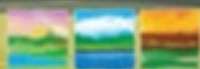

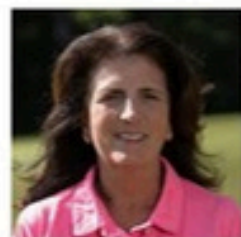

4th Annual Genesis of New Bern Cup

The 4th annual Genesis of New Bern Cup is set for Sunday September 13, 2026 and will be hosted at Carolina Colours Golf Club. This year the field will include teams from a total of 8 clubs with the addition of Beaufort Club and Ironwood CC. This will be an excellent opportunity for Carolina Colours GC to feature our course conditions and showcase our tournament hospitality to a wide audience of golfers in Eastern North Carolina.

If you have played in this event on the Carolina Colours GC team in the past, then you already know a little about the pride that comes with representing the club and competing in this event, not to mention the fun and camaraderie experienced. For the 2026 event, we are looking to hear from members that would like to be a part of the team. A recent change in the format, moving to best net scoring between 2 playing partners, should ease the pressure that normally comes with a tournament like this.

The entry fee for members is \$35, which includes a practice round, tournament round, tee gift, food & beverages post tournament, along with the chance to win a new Genesis if you get a hole in one on number 12. A logo'd team golf shirt from Bald Head Blues will also be made available at an exceptional price of \$40.

Handicap Max: Men 20, Women 30 USGA GHIN handicap index, verifiable

Team Makeup: Each team consists of 13 players

- 1 Pro (Blue tees)
- 4 Men (White tees)
- 4 Men 65+ (Gold)
- 4 Women (Red tees)

Maximum hole score: Double Par

Team Score Calculation: 1 gross score (pro), 6 net scores combined,

Winning Team: Team with the lowest combined 7 scores

Tie Break: 3 team members from each team compete in a shootout on hole 9, closest to pin wins. (1 white tee, 1 gold tee, 1 red tee)

Hole in One: Genesis of New Bern will provide a new Genesis for a hole in one on hole # 12.

Food & Beverages: Beverage cart with items available for donations on the course
Lunch/Beverages served immediately following tournament

Awards: New Bern Mayor Jeffrey Odam will award the Genesis of New Bern Cup to the winning team. Prizes for low gross, men & women
Winning team keeps the Cup until the next event and has the option to host if they have not previously hosted.
