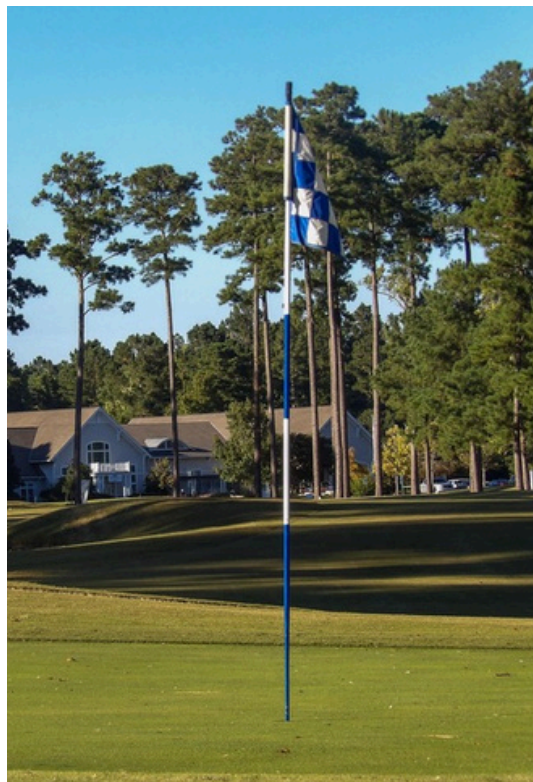

# From the Superintendent

Shelby Choate



April certainly made its presence known this year—and then some. What is typically a month of steady spring transition quickly turned into an early taste of summer, with temperatures pushing well above seasonal norms into the 90s. The heat has accelerated turf growth across the property, keeping our team on our toes with mowing frequencies, moisture management, and overall course conditioning. While it's been a challenge for us running hoses in April, which is incredibly disheartening for the summer to come. The crew has rallied and done a great job shifting gears and multi-tasking.

The biggest highlight this month will be the completion of our bunker renovations on the front nine. After several months of hard work, we are pleased to report that these projects should be buttoned soon. This renovation focused heavily on improving drainage, addressing long-standing issues with water retention, and ensuring a more consistent playing surface throughout each bunker. With new piping, washed gravel, proper grading, and fresh sand in place, these bunkers should perform as intended—even during heavy rain events.

We appreciate everyone's patience during this process, as construction zones and equipment movement can always impact the flow of play. Our crew worked diligently to minimize disruption while maintaining safety and quality standards, and we're proud of the finished product. The improvements not only enhance playability but also contribute to the long-term sustainability of the golf course.

# From the Superintendent (cont.)

As we move into May, our focus will shift toward maintaining turf health under increasing heat stress, continuing detailed course setup, finishing up other ongoing projects, and fine-tuning the newly renovated areas. With the early arrival of warmer weather, irrigation management will be key, and we'll be closely monitoring moisture levels to keep playing conditions firm and consistent greenside.

For the safety of our maintenance team, we kindly ask that all golfers refrain from hitting into greens while employees are present and actively working—especially when watering. Please wait until the employee has cleared the area or has clearly waved you up to hit. Your patience and awareness help ensure a safe environment for everyone on the course, and we truly appreciate your cooperation.

We're looking forward to a strong season ahead and hope you enjoy the improvements out on the front nine. As always, thank you for your continued support, and we'll see you on the course.

# Terri's Tips!

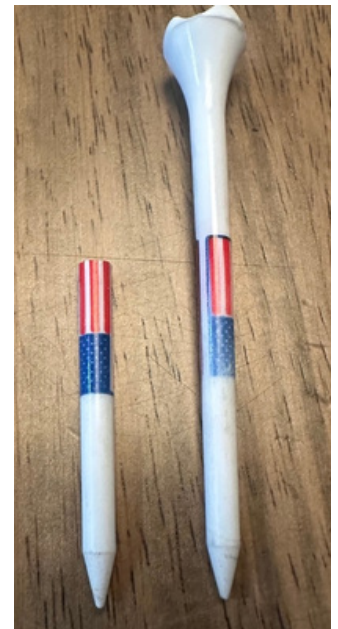

## Broken Tees and Deep Divots

Last week, I arrived at our designated teaching area for the first lesson of the day and was concerned to find fresh, deep divots and broken tees. (Pictures are below - maybe someone knows these tees!) As a reminder, please use the other designated areas on the range for general practice, not the Teaching Area, and remember to fill your divots with the sand provided.

Seeing this inspired the topic for today's article: how to fix a "steep" golf swing. If you watch professional golf, you will notice that the pros take very shallow divots and rarely break their tees when hitting a driver. If you find yourself digging deep into the turf or snapping tees, your swing is likely coming down too vertically. This often leads to pulls, slices, weak contact, or "chunky" shots.



# Terri's Tips! (cont.)

## Here is how you can begin to shallow out your swing:

### 1. Fix your takeaway

Steepness often starts here. If you snatch the club inside or lift it straight up, you are set up for a steep downswing.

- Feel like the clubhead stays outside your hands during the early phase.
  - Keep the clubface square rather than rolling it open.
    - Think "low and wide" instead of "quick and up."
- Ensure your shoulders and hips turn as the club moves toward the top.

### 2. Start the downswing with the lower body

- Remember, the downswing should be initiated by your lower body, not your arms.
- As you start your downswing with the hips/feet/legs (not trunk), you want to feel your hands drop (not throw) down to your side.
  - This helps the club fall into a shallower slot naturally.

### 3. Feel the Club 'Shallow More'

This is the big one. Try these feels:

- 'Lay the club down' behind you
- Feel your right elbow tuck closer to your side
- Imagine skipping a stone sidearm

Pictures of shallow downswing - notice hands are behind - and lower than right shoulder.

<p> <b>2. Equipment Hazard</b> A tractor blocks the green in front of the hole. Figure it out.</p>	<p> <b>11. The People's Tee</b> Everyone tees off from the same tee box near the big tree.</p>
<p> <b>3. Tee It Up!</b> You have the option of teeing up your ball on any and all shots during the hole.</p>	<p> <b>12. Tee Box Roulette</b> Roulette Wheel on the Tee Box - follow the instructions for tee box selection and club selection.</p>
<p> <b>4. Country Club Croquet</b> On the green, use the provided croquet mallet and go through the hoops to putt into the hole.</p>	<p> <b>13. Corn Hole Finish</b> Once on the green, finish the hole by sinking a bean bag in the cornhole board. If all four teammates miss, add two strokes to your score and move to hole 14. If any one makes it, just add one stroke and move on.</p>

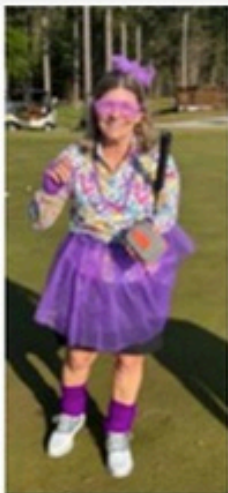

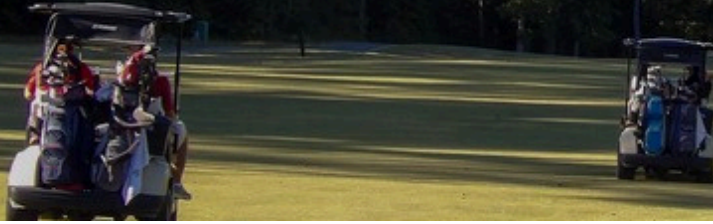
